Christine Fancher, Social Worker and Volunteer Coordinator at Supportive Care of Orleans, contacted Steve about Bella, an 11-year-old West Highland Terrier in the Pet Peace of Mind Program. Steve heard about Pet Peace of Mind through his brother-in-law who adopted a pet through the program. Bella's owner was on hospice and the family wanted to make sure that she went to a loving home. Dogs have always been a part of Steve's life and said yes right away.

"When Bella's owner passed, I was able to meet the sister and kids. It's really an honor," explained Steve. Bella went through a mourning period where she was depressed, but quickly perked up. "She acts like a puppy now! She gets younger every day," said Steve, Before Bella was under Steve's care, she was crate trained and slept in her crate every night. It did not take her long to decide that Steve's bed was much more comfortable than her crate. Bella loves the outdoors and walks around the yard, but not long walks in the neighborhood. "She knows what she wants, when she wants. If I take her for a longer walk, she will sit right down," said Steve. When asked how he would describe the overall Pet Peace of Mind Experience, Steve leaves us with this pawsitive thought, "It's really a pleasure. Bella is great company."
